"Mortal, can these bones live?" Ezekiel 37:3 Filled with Hope,



Adult Christian Education Offerings and Small Groups

In building classes resume. For those who choose not to gather in person, Zoom participation will be available for many groups, noted below.

Intergenerational Sunday School Begins with a Sunday Funday Kick-off September 12th at 10:15 a.m. Ages 1-101 meet us in the Family room and come explore ancient Babylon, and learn of the courage of Daniel and his community as they learned to trust God.

Sunday: New Member Class begins September 12th in the FOC Library beginning at 10:15 a.m. We will learn about our congregation, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, and explore Luther's Small Catechism as we explore what it means to be Christians in the Lutheran tradition. Did you hear that our Garden Bounty Ingathering total passed the 1,000 pounds of produce mark as of August 11? More specifically, that is 1,085 pounds of squash, beans, plums, cucumbers, eggplant, potatoes, peppers, tomatoes, berries, garlic, kohlrabi, beets and apples to feed the hungry! Thanks to generous donations from Pastor Kit and Dan, Judy and Dave and several other church members plus a few neighbors, we believe we can achieve at least ONE TON of fresh produce provided to local food distribution groups by the end of September! We received a donation from Scouts who planned and planted a garden just to feed the hungry. We also received a donation from an amazing 67 year-old woman who rode her bicycle from near Jason Lee Middle School with a backpack full of vegetables. Judy and Dave have graciously delivered our produce each week to Community Kitchen of Fruit Valley, HELP (Healthy Equitable Living Project) at First Presbyterian Church and Martha's Pantry at Vancouver United Church of Christ.

Keep watering and tending those gardens through this crazy hot summer and bring your produce donations to church on Sunday mornings between 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. through Sunday September 26th, or call the office if you would like to drop off during the week or need a pickup.


